(a weekend for Initiated Men)

Theme: The Deeper Journey

Venue: Mt Barney Wilderness Retreat (Bartopia)

Where is the weekend being held?

The venue is Mt Barney Wilderness Retreat, set high in the McPherson mountain range on the border between Queensland and NSW. The Retreat adjoins Mt Barney National Park, a World Heritage listed wilderness area.

What is The Weekend About?

The weekend is designed to deepen your own journey as an initiated man, using the tools of nature, silence, connecting with other initiated brothers, and through soul-based teaching. There will be fire, drumming, poetry reading and story telling at night, and extended time alone in nature during the day.

Who Is This For?

Initiated men have expressed a deep desire to continue and deepen their journey. This weekend provides a container to encourage this deepening. This is for any man who has completed the Men's Rites of Passage

anywhere in the world. It is not offered to any man who has not done MROP.

Over the weekend, there will be opportunity to confirm and affirm each man's ongoing spiritual journey – our life-long journey towards becoming who we truly are.

What Does The Weekend Involve?

The format includes a three teaching sessions around the understanding the true self through a deeper connection with nature and God. You will need to bring your own snacks (museli bars etc) for lunch on Saturday. Catering will be provided for dinner on Friday and Saturday nights and breakfast on Saturday and Sunday. The event will commence at noon on Friday and conclude at noon Sunday.

Accommodation

You will sleep in cabins (or tents/hammocks if you bring your own). You will need to bring your own linen. After we receive your application, we will send you further

details about what to bring, and where you will need to assemble. A 4WD vehicle will ferry participants up to the venue. Please let us know if you have a suitable vehicle and would be available to assist with transport to the site.

There are risks involved in being in the Australian bush (ticks, fire awareness, snakes, getting lost), but if each man is responsible for his own behaviour and safety instructions are followed, these are minimised.

The venue is 750m above sea level so the nights will be cold and the days mild to warm. Bring at least three layers of clothing and a waterproof jacket in the event of rain.
